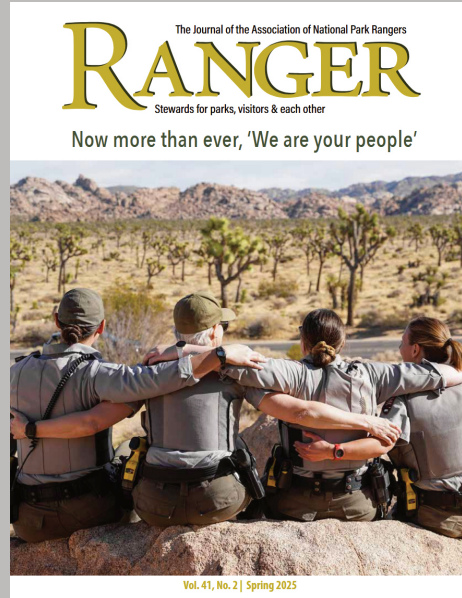
First Ranger Rendezvous, Sept. 30- Oct. 2, 1977 / ANPR.org
